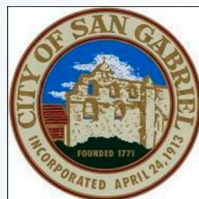


## **Class Code of Conduct**

## **Community Academy**

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## **San Gabriel Police Department**

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**The San Gabriel Police Department's Community Academy is a free and informative twelve-week program hosted by the San Gabriel Police Department.**

## Mission

The mission of the Community Academy is to give participants a closer look at San Gabriel Police operations while concurrently reinforcing the principles of community policing. We strive to strengthen the relationship between the San Gabriel community and its police department. Through the curriculum we hope to provide a greater awareness and understanding of law enforcement's role in the community and to enhance public safety.



## Description

Presented in a friendly, casual environment, the course covers a wide variety of subject areas including police communications, criminal law and procedures, street crime enforcement, criminal investigations, defense tactics, community programs, and more. The classes are taught by experienced police officers and staff. The course concludes with a culmination ceremony, where participants receive a certificate of completion. *The course does **not** certify participants as law enforcement officers.*

## Class Schedule

The Community Academy meets one day per week for 12 consecutive weeks. Most classes take place on Thursday nights. The culmination ceremony takes place on the 12th week. A full class schedule is distributed to registered students. Register early, as space is limited to 20 students per class. Additional class dates will be announced soon.

Each academy class will be limited to 20 participants. Qualified applicants in excess of the class capacity will be filed in the order received and assigned to future academy classes.

If selected for the Community Academy, participants will be expected to attend at least eight of the twelve sessions in order to receive a certificate of completion.



## Qualified Applicants

- ◆ Minimum 18 years-old.
- ◆ If 18 years old and in high school, applicant must be in good academic standing.
- ◆ Must live, work, or attend school within the City of San Gabriel.\*\*
- ◆ Must not be on active probation or parole, or any type of court-ordered supervised release.
- ◆ Must not have any prior felony convictions or arrests, no prior arrests for any violent crimes, and cannot have any pending criminal cases.
- ◆ Must be able to pass a background check.
- ◆ Cannot be a party in any prior or current litigation involving the city.
- ◆ Applicants must sign a Waiver of Liability and Release and agree to abide by the Class Code of Conduct.

*\*\*The Chief of Police or his designee reserves the right to make the final decision regarding any applicant's admission into the Community Academy. Some exceptions may be made on a case by case basis.*
